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



# **WAUKEE SILVER CORD MISSION**

The purpose of the Waukee Silver Cord Program is to instill within students the importance of community service and encourage students to be accountable for investing in their own education and in their community on a regular basis during their school years.

# WHEN CAN I BEGIN?

Students are eligible to earn Silver Cord hours starting November 15 of 9th grade and ending April 30 of 12th grade. All eligible students are registered on our website, and sign up is not required for this optional program.

Volunteer service must benefit a non-profit organization. Approved opportunities are shared on our website and social media, or participants can find their own ways to give back. Students may choose to earn up to half of the total required hours volunteering within the Waukee Community School District. Students must submit their hours on the website within 30 days of completion. Those volunteer 175 hours by April 30 of their senior year will earn the distinction of wearing a silver cord during their graduation ceremony.
